The Great Migration – more than 1.5 million animals

The circle of life is nowhere more evident than during the migration of millions of wildebeest, zebras and gazelles. They leave the southern Serengeti, usually once the rains end in June, to forage for food and water in the north, eventually ending up in Kenya's Maasai Mara Game Reserve. November marks the return of the short rains and the animals begin to head back south into the Serengeti. As the animals make their way north, they must navigate the Grumeti river, home to numerous crocodiles that feast on the wildebeest as they attempt to cross the river.

The best months to see the migration in the Serengeti is December through May, although April and May normally have heavy rains.

Tanzania's National Parks

Serengeti:

At 5622 sq miles, the Serengeti is the largest national park in Tanzania. In addition to the migration, the Serengeti contains the largest concentration of lions in Africa.

Ngorongoro Crater:

This is the best place to see rhinos. Approximately 25,000 animals call the crater home, living in forests, lakes, marshes, grasslands, and plains.

Lake Manyara:

More than 380 species of birds can be found at Lake Manyara. It is also famous for its tree-climbing lions, hippopotamus, and its stunning views of the Rift Valley.

Tarangire:

Large herds of elephants, up to 300 in a group, can be seen nestled along the famous baobab trees. Birds are also abundant, especially between October and May.

Arusha National Park:

Arusha is home of Mt. Meru, Tanzania's second highest peak (14,980 feet). It also contains Ngurdoto Crater and the Momela Lakes. If you're short on time, this is the best option for a one or two day safari.

Balloon Safari:

View the Serengeti from a truly unique perspective as you soar over untouched areas of the Serengeti.

Safari packages*

3 Day/ 2 Night Safari:

Start with Lake Manyara and the great Rift wall. Next you're off to Ngorongoro Crater to see rhinos and lions. Finish with Tarangire for the elephants & birds.

4 Day/ 3 Night Safari:

Visit Lake Manyara, Ngorongoro Crater and spend 24 hours in the Serengeti for 2 game drives (morning and evening)!

Visit the same parks as the 4-day safari but enjoy an extra day in the Serengeti. The Great Migration of wildebeest and zebra is a must see.

Add a stop to Olduvai Gorge in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, where 3.7 million year old hominid footprints have been discovered.
